

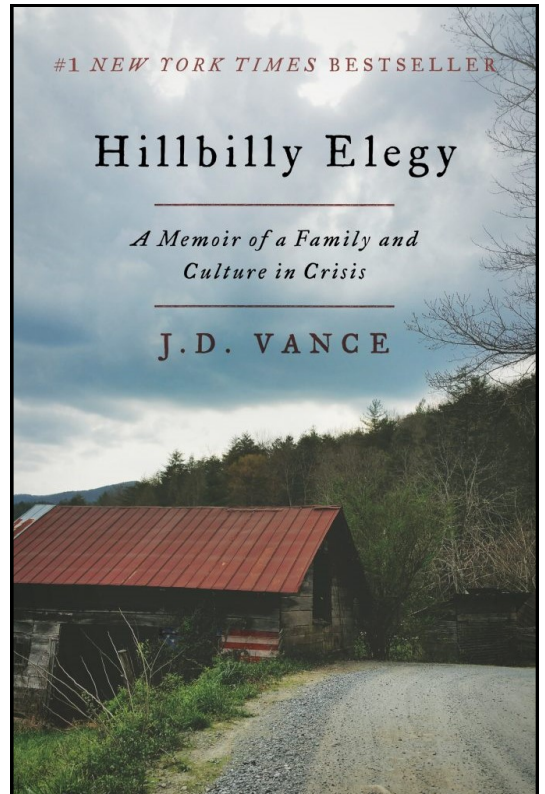
# Go Big Read

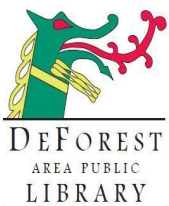
